SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

We are justly proud of our high standard of uniform at St. Joseph. Our expectation is that it is to be worn with dignity and pride at all times, this includes the PE uniform during PE lessons and sporting activities. St Joseph's places great emphasis on being part of a community – one where students are keen to learn and are proud to be part of the school. Governors and teachers believe that a smart uniform is central to the school ethos where every learner is encouraged to be their best.

Students are expected to take responsibility for wearing the correct school uniform and comply with this policy at all times in school and on journeys to and from school. Students who are inappropriately dressed will face sanctions in accordance with the school behaviour policy.

The school uniform can be purchased from Termtex – order forms are available from school reception and the Company attend school one day each June to allow trying on/buying uniform.

EQUIPMENT

Students will bring AT LEAST a pen, pencil and ruler to school in a bag large enough to hold an A4 folder in addition to subject specific equipment/books and their planner.

HOT WEATHER

In the event of exceptionally hot weather, it will be the decision of the Head Teacher to implement the hot weather guidance.

The guidance may be implemented on a specific day, or for any extended period of time and may be rescinded if the exceptionally hot weather ceases. It is not expected that normal summer temperatures would cause the implementation of this policy.

BREAK AND LUNCHTIME ARRANGEMENTS

All students are expected to wear full school uniform at break and lunchtime unless the hot weather policy applies. If involved in active games on the all-weather pitch, or the playground, students may remove their jumper and tie and put on trainers, but must put on full school uniform (including shoes) when the bell sounds.

STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO WEAR FULL SCHOOL UNIFORM DURING PPD DAYS AND FORMAL SCHOOL EVENTS. THIS INCLUDES TRIPS UNLESS SPECIFIED BY THE MEMBER OF STAFF IN CHARGE (unless the hot weather policy applies).

MOBILE PHONES

In our School Policy, and to assist student safety, three basic rules have been agreed:

Mobile phones/devices may be brought to school, and there use may be permitted in specific lessons when instructed and directed by the teacher. Mobile phones/devices are brought into school are done so at the owners risk, and the school is not liable for any loss or damage.

Once a pupil is on school site, until 3.20pm (2.30pm on Thursdays), they are NOT allowed to use a mobile phone/device at ANY TIME; this obviously includes break-time and lunchtime. The ONLY exception to this is the permitted times in the classroom when determined by the teacher.

If a mobile phone/device is seen, or found to have been used, in breach of this rule, the equipment WILL be confiscated, and will only be returned to a parent/guardian at the END of the next SCHOOL DAY following the day of the confiscation. Be aware that if a mobile phone/device is confiscated on a Friday, it WILL NOT be returned until the following Monday, at 3.15pm. There will be NO exceptions made.

If there is a need for students to contact parents, they can to go to reception and arrange with the office staff to contact parents.

Communication between school and home is extremely important and must be handled in a secure way. For this reason, we ask that if you wish to make contact with your child during school time, then please do so via the school office, giving the reason for the contact. Please do not ring or text your child's phone whilst they are in school, as this could lead to it being confiscated as per the policy.

NB All clothing and property should be clearly marked with the owner's name. Labelled property will be returned to its owner. Unlabelled property will be placed in the Lost Property store and disposed of in accordance with policy in place at that time
