Year 11 Results 2018

Our return to school this year has been a real pleasure. Students have started with a real sense of purpose and are demonstrating our core values of our new Mission Statement. Thank you to all our families who support us each day and without whom we would not be so successful. Our Year 11 students deserve particular credit for the attitude and focus they are already showing as we move towards the second half term and their mock exams.

Our Results Highlights were:

56.4% of students gained a Grade 5 in English, up by 10% on the previous year

49.6% of students gained a Grade 5 in Maths up by 15% on the previous year.

39% of students gained a strong pass (Grade 5 or above) in English and Maths combined, an increase of 12% on the previous year.

64.1% of students gained a standard pass (Grade 4 or above) in English and Maths combined, an increase of 5% on the previous year.

Our Provisional Progress Grading, for the students who studied at St Joseph's, is above the national average for schools in England and Wales and we are delighted. When we take all the students into account our Progress 8 is - 0.07 which is at national average. This is a significant increase from last year's -0.24. Well done to all our staff and students.
