Year 10 Mock Exam Week: Monday 24th June 2019.

To give students a valuable experience, Mock Exam Week will be run in the same way as the real GCSE exams. The results will give us a clear indication of current progress. Teachers will use the Mock Exam results to identify where additional support is needed, so that all pupils can achieve their best results in Year 11.

Details of how the Mock Exam results are compiled are detailed at the end of this letter.

- Mock exam week will begin on Monday 24th June. The timetable is attached. Copies are also available on the Year 10 notice board in the foyer and on our website.
- Exams take place in the hall, unless otherwise stated.
- Students are expected to arrive ten minutes before the start of the Mock Exam, with all the correct equipment, in full school uniform.
- There is no study leave. Students are expected to be in lessons when they are not in an exam. Staff will use this time to teach, see individuals and ensure there is no underachievement.
- If a Mock exam is missed, then the exam time will be re-arranged and students will need to complete the Mock Exam.
- Pupils should be preparing for their Year 10 Mock Exams in the appropriate way at home- through detailed revision, creating mind maps, mnemonics, revision flash cards, testing their knowledge and understanding as well as practising exam questions. **All exam boards have past papers on their websites with mark schemes.**
