## MOBILE PHONES/SMART DEVICES

- 1. Students must not use a mobile phone/smart device of any kind from when they step through the school gate in the morning, until after they leave the school site at the end of the day. If mobile phones/smart devices are seen, or their unauthorised use has been brought to a member of staff's attention, they will be confiscated, and will only be returned to a parent at the end of the next school day. If they are confiscated on a Friday, then they will be returned to a parent at the end of the school day of the following Monday. There will be no exceptions. Persistent offenders will face a more serious sanction.
- 2. If a phone/smart device/iPad/iPod is brought into school, it is done so at the owner's risk and the school will not be liable for any loss or damage.
- 3. It is expected that if brought into school, the mobile phone/smart device/iPad/iPod will remain safely locked in a pupil's bag. Should a pupil choose to keep the phone/device on their person, it will be confiscated (as per 1 above) if it falls from their pocket or 'goes off' during the school day.

The excellent reputation of our school is the result of Governors and staff insisting on the highest standards of behaviour, uniform and appearance of our pupils. Our school rules are designed to maintain these standards; all staff will apply these rules fairly and consistently and will challenge any pupil who does not comply with them.
