## **Email communication:**

A reminder about the etiquette when sending an email to your teachers:

- 3. Write in full sentences and explain clearly why you are emailing.
- 4. End the email in a polite manner (eg thank you Miss Kennedy for your help)
- 5. Sign off with your name.
